An innovation should meet one or more of the following criteria:

- 1. Quality Students and/or staff agree that the innovation increases quality in the course, program, office, or institution.
- 2. *Efficiency* The innovation contributes to more efficient processes.
- 3. Cost Effectiveness The innovation adds value to the institution while containing or reducing costs.
- 4. *Replication* The innovation is easy to replicate at other institutions.
- 5. *Creativity* The innovation is original and creative.
- 6. *Timeliness* The innovation is not more than five years old at the institution, allowing plenty of time for it to be tested.

League Alliance colleges determine their own eligibility criteria and selection protocol and submit one winning Innovation of the Year. Nominations are encouraged from all areas of the college: full- and part-time faculty, administrators, and professional and support personnel; the range of participation is determined by each college.

The MCC College Catalog and Student Handbook had been PDF-based in the past, and it was difficult for students to find information. After researching online catalog management software, MCC realized we could provide equivalent functionality with an in-house solution.

MCC leveraged existing technology to move PDF-based content into an IBM Domino application. This allowed us to organize the content, provide a user-friendly website, and give content editors access to their sections. The online catalog also enables us to provide the most up-to-date information to other resources, such as MCC web pages, the Banner information system, and curriculum proposals and assessment databases.

Moving forward, the online catalog will reduce costs of outside systems, and it will decrease errors that occurred when catalog information had resided in more than one location. We will also be able to make changes as we receive feedback from people, rather than wait on an outside provider to make updates.
