

Rodney Eugene Clark is a career military officer with over 20 years of experience leading in the Military Police field. Rodney grew up near Houston, Texas and began his military career in 1995. After four years of enlisted service he received his undergraduate degree from Texas State University and was commissioned an officer in the US Air Force. After serving over ten years in law enforcement and police administrator positions with the Air Force, he transitioned to the US Army and went on to serve as a Military Police commander and Director of Emergency Services (Police and Fire) in the US Army.
