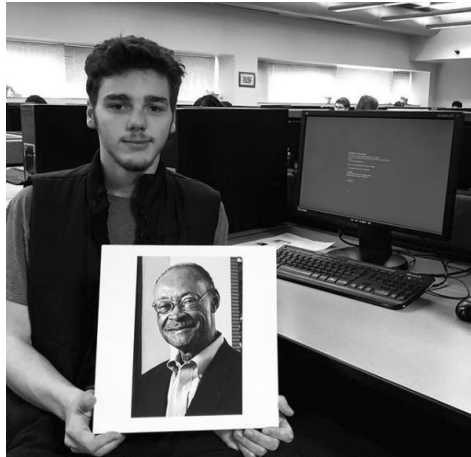
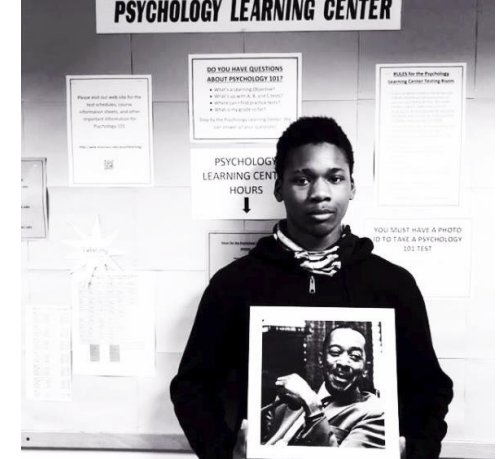

monroecrochester THURGOOD MARSHALL was a lawyer and a civil rights advocate who became the nation's first African American Supreme Court Justice in 1967. As legal counsel for the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), he guided the litigation that destroyed Jim Crow segregation. Marshall argued 32 cases before the U.S. Supreme Court – more than anyone else in history. During the decades he was a member of the highest court in the land (1967-1991). Justice Marshall established an inspiring record for supporting the voiceless American. He died in 1993. GREENE, JR. was an educator, an entrepreneur, a venture capitalist and a pioneering Silicon Valley technologist who developed high-speed semiconductor computer-memory systems. He started two technology companies, a venture firm and founded the GO-Positive Foundation which offers leadership programs for high school and college students. "Success in life is not about 'me' but about what you can do to help others," he said. Greene died in 2009 at the age of 71. monroecrochester MAE C. JEMISON, a physician and the 1st African American woman astronaut to travel in space, was selected for the astronaut program in 1987. Her inspiration for applying to the program was Star Trek's Lieutenant Uhura. On September 12, 1992, she flew into space aboard the Endeavour. As space mission specialist, Jemison was responsible for conducting crew-related scientific experiments on the shuttle. After leaving NASA in 1993, she taught at Dartmouth and established a company that researches, develops and markets advanced technologies. (pictured: MCC STUDENT SELENA RAMOS)
