Health Studies Clinical Track (HS03)


Did You Know?

- The Health Studies Clinical Track was developed in response to the large number of students interested in healthcare careers and the limited number of seats in MCC's competitive healthcare programs.
- Approximately 90% of qualified applicants did not get a seat in the competitive healthcare program to which they applied last year.
- Many students who have taken point-bearing courses within Liberal Arts and did not get into a competitive program have ended up without sound alternatives, often accumulating excessive credits, without coursework that could prepare them for transfer.

The Health Studies Clinical Track was created to address these issues. The Health Studies Clinical Track serves as a pathway for students to prepare to apply to competitive programs, yet serve as a back-up for students who are not accepted into a competitive program, providing a solid foundation that also helps prepare students to apply for transfer or switch to another track if needed.

HS03 Quick Facts:

- The Health Studies Clinical Track includes all point bearing courses needed to apply for healthcare programs in the competitive admission process (with the exception of MTH165 for Rad Tech and Surg Tech)
- Students can apply for competitive programs while in Health Studies
- HS03 can prepare students for programs other than MCC Competitive Programs or BSN Transfer including: Occupational Therapy, Community Health, and Public Health.





Faculty Liaison Spotlight: Cristin Finch, HSPW

The **New HSPW Video** (providing a brief overview of HSPW programs) was finished in July! We are already utilizing it at AR events and Dual Enrollment visits.
