To bring to the workshop

- Student's 2009 Federal Tax Return
- Parents' 2009 Federal Tax Return if you are a dependent student.
- Student's 2009 New York State Tax Return
- Parents' 2009 New York State Tax Return if you are under 22 years of age.
- You need to know the total amount of untaxed income received in 2009. If you, your spouse, or your parents (if applicable) received any untaxed income during 2009, such as child support you need report it in the financial aid application.

To do before the workshop

- Apply for the Federal Personal Identification Number (PIN) at www.pin.ed.gov. (and your parents if applicable)
- Print the FAFSA on the WEB worksheet at www.fafsa.gov to gather all the information needed to complete the application.

- Have a valid e-mail address to receive information about your application.
