The award-winning film *Finding Kalman* brings together history, biography, the power of art, and the universal experiences of love and loss as one family's journey of discovery teaches about the human capacity to bring light into darkness.

In *Finding Kalman* Anna Jacobs, a teenager during the Holocaust, inspires her children and grandchildren with stories of her brother Kalman, a mischievous boy who tried to escape the Warsaw ghetto with her. As the film moves from archival footage in Poland to summers in a Catskills, N.Y. bungalow colony to the present day family in the U.S. and Israel, viewers see how four generations grapple differently with their shared history.
