MCC's 2+2 Dual Admission program enables students to take the first two years of their bachelor's degree curriculum at MCC, then transfer as a junior to one of more than 25 participating four-year colleges.

Students at all State University of New York (SUNY) two- and four-year colleges can transfer seamlessly to other SUNY campuses without having to re-take courses and incur unnecessary costs. Because of MCC's high academic standards, our graduates are sought after for admission by highly selective institutions such as Amherst College, Smith College, American University and Cornell University to name a few. No two degree programs are the same. Transfer requirements at one college may vastly differ from those at another college. MCC



faculty and Career and Transfer Center counselors stay aware of changing requirements—in higher education in general and especially within specific disciplines—in order to help students take the right courses and successfully transfer.

Degrees Completed with Less Debt

MCC helps families achieve the dream of a college education. Our tuition is one of the most affordable in the state at \$3,240 per year (2013-2014). The average annual tuition for SUNY community colleges is \$3,960, while annual tuition (undergraduate) at the College at Brockport and the University of Rochester is \$5,870 and \$46,150, respectively. By completing their first two years of study at MCC, students can save significantly on the total cost of a bachelor's degree with fewer student loans. Nearly half of MCC students graduate without student-loan debt. For example, within the engineering science discipline alone, Rochester Institute of Technology's mechanical engineering program has distinct required courses as compared to its electrical engineering program. The University at Buffalo's chemical engineering program has different requirements than Clarkson University's chemical engineering program.

To prepare our students to successfully transfer, MCC proactively:

• **Offers** a wider range of courses than ever before.

- **Partners** with area universities so our students can cross register and take specialized courses.
- **Engages** representatives of our transfer partners to keep abreast of changes at the four-year level.
- **Maximizes** courses from other MCC departments so students can earn as many transfer credits as possible.



Flexible Transfer Opportunities

Nationally, more than one in five students who complete a bachelor's degree do so at an institution other than the one where they started, and 15 percent of students had previously attended college in at least one other state, according to a recent study by the National Student Clearinghouse Research Center. At SUNY, roughly 38 percent of (or two of every five) students who earn a bachelor's degree do so at an institution other than where they first enrolled, and of those, 75 percent earn their degree from another SUNY college.
