Forty-eight MCC students earned the national 2010-11 President's Volunteer Service Award, engaging in a total of 12,759 hours of civic service.

In 2010, more than 90 percent of our nursing, radiologic technology and dental hygiene program graduates passed licensure and certification exams, exceeding state and national averages.
