About the PROGRAM

Your MCC Cinema and Screen Studies degree specifically prepares you to transfer to a four-year institution to earn a bachelor's degree in film

or mass media. It's the identical curriculum you'd have at a four-year college.

The key difference: MCC's affordable tuition can save you thousands of dollars. That's important, because you're going to need the money for filmmaking materials – which, at most major film schools, can often equal or exceed tuition costs.

You'll learn hands-on in our state-of-the-art production facilities, which include:

- ▶ Three Mac labs equipped with the latest software, including animation software
- ▶ A 1000-square-foot TV studio with three cameras, digital switcher, 2 Chyron character generators, and professional lighting
- ▶ 6 editing suites equipped with Avid editing software
- ▶ Digital audio editing capability

And, at MCC you'll be able to apply for internships immediately, in your first semester – an opportunity to earn valuable real-life experience that most colleges don't make available to freshmen. In fact, several of our students have worked on movies shot in the Rochester area.

What you'll STUDY

Along with a core curriculum of humanities, social sciences, natural science and mathematics, you'll choose from a variety of courses in cinema and

screen studies, plus exciting electives. By the time you graduate, you'll have completed 62-64 credits to transfer towards a bachelor's degree.
