CHE 124 only required for students w/out AAS in Nursing

Students must complete all course listed above with a grade of C or higher. All courses must be completed before clinicals may begin. The application deadline date is the 3rd Wednesday in Jan. for a fall start. Students must submit a separate nursing application in addition to the SUNY application. Nazareth College

Bachelor of Science, Major in Nursing

Prerequisites for college transfer students:

- ANT 102
- BIO 142 & 143
- BIO 202
- Minimum CGPA of 2.5
- MTH 160
- BIO 155 & 156*
- PSY 101
- PSY 212

Students must complete all courses listed above with a grade of C+ or higher.

*Note: if a student has BIO 142 & 143 completed, Nazareth will waive BIO 155 & 156.

Additional core curriculum courses (as per Nazareth) are recommended.

Deadline dates: The part-time program accepts students on a rolling admission basis. Full-time applicants are encouraged to apply by March 15th for fall admissions and November 15th for spring admissions. Students are accepted for fall and spring semesters. LPNs are awarded credit for Anatomy and Physiology.

A.A.S. degree in nursing will guarantee 60 hours in transfer credit to Nazareth for RN to BS program.

Accelerated Bachelor's Program for Non-Nurses

Admission requirements include: Bachelor's Degree in a non-nursing field, BIO 142 & 143, BIO 202, BIO 217, MTH 160, and PSY 212. A one calendar year program (three semesters: summer, fall and spring) that includes the coursework and clinical of the four final semesters (junior and senior years) of a traditional BS program.

RN to BS Program

Admission requirements include: Completion of a Diploma or Associate Degree in Nursing from an accredited school of nursing, RN licensure within the United States or U.S. territory, two references, CGPA of 3.0 preferred, professional statement, and resume. Students may transfer up to 64 arts and science credits, and are granted 32 nursing credits automatically upon admission. Program is primarily online with no clinical courses. "CLEP" courses accepted.

RN to BS to MS Program

Same admission requirements as RN to BS program with the addition of a statistics grade of C or above, and selection of an NP specialty. This program is designed for exceptionally strong students.

Associate in Applied Science - A.A.S.

Acceptance is highly competitive. It is advisable to meet with a MCC Counselor to discuss specific course selection.

This program traditionally generates more applications than can be accommodated. The selection criteria, deadlines, admission requirements, prerequisites, and commonly asked questions about admission can be found in the brochure Health-Related Programs: Competitive Admission Information or on-line at www.monroecc.edu/go/nursing. It is strongly recommended that students complete additional coursework required for the degree.

Prerequisites to apply include:

- Regents Elementary Algebra or Math A Regents exam or MTH 098
- High School Chemistry or CHE 100/121/124/145/151
- High School Biology or BIO 120/133+132/142 or higher

Students must complete all courses listed above with a grade of C or better.

Dual Admission Programs for Bachelor of Science in Nursing:

- Roberts Wesleyan College (2+2)
- St. John Fisher College (2+2)
- SUNY Upstate Medical University (2+2) (Must be accepted to MCC RN program in order to be eligible)
- University of Rochester (3+1) (Must be accepted to MCC RN program in order to be eligible)

Finger Lakes Community College

Associate in Applied Science - A.A.S.

Prerequisites for acceptance include:

- Biology (1 year in high school or equivalent)
- Mathematics (algebra recommended)
- Chemistry

Students must complete the major courses with a grade of C or better.

Traditional program is fall entry only. Deadline date is February 1. Spring entry available for LPNs only (accelerated program).

Nursing (NSG) 101 and the first clinical course (N203) are offered in the summer at RWC for transfer students.

Deadline dates: Priority deadline for acceptance for the fall semester is February 1st. Transfer students expecting to start as junior Nursing majors will be notified of eligibility for entrance into NSG 101 (a required course for the clinical experience) by April 1st. A January start date is also available but students will not begin the clinical course (N203) that semester.
