FINANCIAL AID TIMELINE

SEPTEMBER – NOVEMBER

- Research scholarships, grants and programs to help fund your education.

DECEMBER

- Visit www.fafsa.ed.gov and review the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) 4caster so that you will know exactly what information is required when the time comes to submit the form.
- Request your Federal PIN at www.pin.ed.gov. You will need this to submit the FAFSA online and it will act as your signature on all federal financial aid processes.

JANUARY – FEBRUARY

- Complete and submit your federal tax return if applicable. Parent tax information is required for students who are under age 24 on January 1 of the award year, unless you are married, are a veteran of the U.S. Armed Forces, have legal dependents, are an orphan or ward of the court, have court appointed legal guardians, or are a documented unaccompanied youth.
- Once you and your parents have filed your federal tax returns, you should submit the FAFSA at www.fafsa.ed.gov. You'll need to have the following information on hand for student and parents:
 - Federal Income Tax Return
 - W-2
 - Statements or totals for untaxed income received
 - Information about assets, including savings, checking, investments
 - Social Security Number
 - Date of Birth
 - Know your School Code: MCC's School Code is 2180
- You can apply for a TAP grant online by following the link from your FAFSA confirmation page or directly with Higher Education Services Corporation (HESC) at www.hesc.com.
- Be sure to request that MCC be sent a copy of your Federal Student Aid Report (SAR).
- Submitting your FAFSA early may improve your ability to receive certain types of aid.



MARCH

- You will receive your SAR within a few days of completing the FAFSA. This letter will detail your eligibility for financial aid programs.
- Review the SAR carefully to ensure that the information matches what you provided when completing the FAFSA. If you find inconsistencies, you should correct them online at www.fafsa.ed.gov.
- Each school that you identified on the FAFSA will receive a copy of your SAR. MCC will use the SAR to evaluate your eligibility for aid and will notify you about your financial aid package.
- March 30 is the deadline to apply for Merit and Presidential scholarships available at MCC through the admissions office at 585.292.2200 or www.monroecc.edu/go/admissions.

APRIL

Decision Time!

- Compare the financial aid packages presented by each college where you have applied.
- Notify colleges about your decision.

MAY

- Apply now for non-merit based scholarships at www.monroecc.edu/go/scholarships.

JUNE

- Apply for student loans (federal direct student loans or private student loans).
- Apply for Aid for Part-Time Students (APTS) if you plan to go to college part-time.

JULY-AUGUST

- Pay tuition and fees through the bursar's office and/or make sure that your financial aid has been applied to your bill.



PAYING FOR EDUCATION

One of the most valuable benefits of an MCC education is its affordable tuition. The money that you save while attending MCC can provide you the means to explore even more options as you continue your education. There are many ways that you can choose to pay for your MCC education. MCC offers financial aid through federal, state and private programs in the form of scholarships, grants, work-study and loans. Last year more than 50 percent of our students benefited from this aid. Programs are available for both full- and part-time study. MCC also offers the Edu-Pay Payment Plan for students who are unable to pay their bill all at once.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships should be the first source of aid that you look to for funding your college career because they do not have to be paid back. MCC awarded more than 400 scholarships in 2008. They may be given to students who show potential for excellence in a certain subject or field of study. Merit based scholarships are awarded based upon academic achievement. Financial need, group affiliations, community involvement and other criteria may be considered for non-merit scholarships. Most MCC Scholarship applications are available beginning March 1.

GRANTS

MCC students who demonstrate a financial need may be eligible for a grant which will not need to be paid back.

Federal PELL grants are available for students who exhibit financial need and who are registered for at least three credit hours. A federal formula is used to determine the grant amount which will range between \$609 - \$5,350. Federal Academic Competitiveness Grants (ACG) and Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants (FSEOG) may be other options for MCC students.

New York state offers the Tuition Assistance Program (TAP) for state residents who are enrolled as full-time students. Awards range from \$500 - \$2,900 annually. A link to the online TAP application will be included on the FAFSA confirmation page. You may also apply online at www.hesc.com.

Aid for Part-Time Students (APTS) is available to New York state residents who are registered for between 3 and 11 credit hours. Need-based awards range from \$100 to \$1,000 annually.

The MCC Financial Aid Office can also provide you with information about specialized grant programs. These may include grants for veterans, police officers, firefighters and minority students.

WORK-STUDY PROGRAMS

Some MCC students may be eligible for government funded work-study programs. These programs provide need-based employment to help students meet education costs and supplement their income. They allow students to work part-time on campus or with an approved off-campus employer. Students who are interested in work-study can indicate this on the FAFSA, and those who are eligible for work-study will see this information on their SAR and MCC financial aid package.

STUDENT LOANS

MCC students whose financial aid needs cannot be met through scholarships, grants or work-study have other loan options to consider. This money will need to be paid back.

Federal Direct Student Loans are available for students enrolled for at least six hours per semester. Depending on need, the loan will be subsidized (interest paid by the federal government while the student is attending school) or unsubsidized (interest begins accruing when the loan is paid out). Interest on federal student loans may be tax deductible. Loans are disbursed directly to MCC.

Parents of dependent students who are enrolled for at least six hours per semester may apply for a Federal Parent PLUS Loan. A credit check is required for this loan. If you apply for and are denied a Federal Parent PLUS Loan due to the credit check, the amount the student can borrow through an unsubsidized Stafford Loan may increase. The maximum amount a parent can borrow is the student's cost of attendance minus other financial aid. PLUS Loans are disbursed directly to MCC.



TAX CREDITS

There is an opportunity for families to claim up to \$2,500 in tuition and fees paid during the calendar year when they file taxes the following year. This can be done as a Tax Credit through the new American Opportunity Tax Credit. More information will become available as the time to file taxes in 2010 nears.

SCHOLARSHIPS AT MCC

In today's economy, the question of how to pay for college is more important than ever before. That is why MCC is committed to providing scholarships to help offset the rising costs of education. In 2008, over 400 students received MCC scholarships totaling over \$400,000.

MCC scholarships may be available for students who demonstrate financial need or who meet other eligibility criteria. Whether you are a star athlete, a great debater or an active community volunteer, there may be an MCC scholarship for you. Students may earn scholarships for many reasons including academic achievement, athletic skill, group affiliation or participation, ethnicity and more. Many of MCC's 70 plus departments also offer scholarships for students enrolled in particular fields of study.

MCC SCHOLARS PROGRAM

Ten \$500 scholarships are awarded each year to outstanding high school seniors who plan to attend MCC. To be eligible to apply, students must have a minimum high school average of 90, rank in the top 20 percent of their graduating class and be actively involved in the community. Applications for the MCC Scholars Program are due by March 30.

PRESIDENTIAL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIPS

Presidential Endowed Scholarship recipients receive full tuition to MCC. To qualify, a student must be in the top 5 percent of their graduating class, have achieved a 1120 minimum SAT score and be enrolled full-time in an MCC degree program. Applications for a Presidential Endowed Scholarship are due March 30.

OTHER SCHOLARSHIP OPTIONS

This guide is designed to provide you with additional information about the many scholarships available at MCC including those for part-time, full-time and general study. You will also find details about departmental scholarships. Be sure to carefully review the eligibility criteria to identify the scholarships that best meet your needs. The application process for each program is also provided. Please pay particular attention to application deadlines. Submit your application as early as possible for priority award consideration.

QUESTIONS TO CONSIDER WHEN ESTABLISHING A SCHOLARSHIP:

Expendable or Endowed Scholarship?

Expendable scholarships are used on an annual basis for merit or need-based awards until the fund is depleted. When establishing an endowed scholarship, the principal will be invested in perpetuity. Interest income generated by the principal will be used to fund scholarships each year. A suggested minimum of \$25,000 is required to establish an endowed scholarship.

Merit- or Need-Based?

A merit scholarship recognizes and fosters high academic standards. Need-based scholarships are awarded based on the financial status of the deserving student. Many scholarships are both merit and need-based.

New or Continuing Student?

You may choose to award your scholarship to a student based on his or her high school record or on academic and/or co-curricular performance while at MCC. Criteria for the awards will be based on your preferences.

Specific department or field of study?

Currently, MCC offers more than 80 degree and 17 certificate programs in career fields. The MCC Foundation will work with you to identify opportunities and establish scholarship criteria that best exemplifies your interests as a donor.
