Active Shooter Awareness

Overview

The Homeland Security Management Institute (HSMI) of Monroe Community College is offering a seminar entitled "Active Shooter Awareness". This course is intended to familiarize the participant with common police response procedures. It includes recommendations for coordinating and cooperating with local police agencies and their expectations during an incident. The course reviews past incidents and lessons learned.

Are you prepared? Active shooter situations are unpredictable and happen quickly. You must be prepared both mentally and physically to deal with an active shooter situation, because they evolve quickly before the arrival of law enforcement.

This course is recommended for security personnel, hospital personnel, school superintendants/school administration, faith-based organizations, businesses, local government and agencies, event planners, civic organizations, staff members assigned to any Emergency Response Team, or equivalent.
