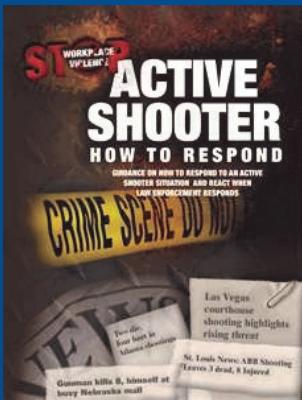

Active Shooter Intermediate

Overview

The Homeland Security Management Institute (HSMI) of Monroe Community College is offering a seminar entitled “Active Shooter Intermediate”. Increasing numbers of parents, faculty members, and students are becoming seriously concerned, that, despite wide media coverage of repeated tragic mass murders in schools, there is little or nothing in place to effectively prevent a similar incident from happening to themselves or their family members in their local workplace, school districts if a deranged individual decided to stage such an attack.

Active shooter situations are unpredictable and happen quickly. You must be prepared both mentally and physically to deal with an active shooter situation, because they evolve quickly before the arrival of law enforcement.

This two and a half hour course is intended to build upon the awareness level instruction previously offered. This course will consist mainly of a tabletop exercise and will focus on the response phase of an active shooter incident. It is intended to test emergency response capabilities; develop and build working relationships needed during such an incident; and rehearse agency responsibilities. The exercise will be led by a facilitator and will place participants to role play in a scenario-based exercise.
