Family & Community Emergency Preparedness

Overview

The Homeland Security Management Institute (HSMI) of Monroe Community College is offering a free one hour training course entitled “Family & Community Emergency Preparedness”. This course is an introductory level and is designed to educate citizens about their role in an emergency, disaster or terrorist event affecting their family and community. Citizen preparedness is the foundation of a nation’s preparedness.



About the Course

The main goal of this course is to provide the participant with information and resources to help protect yourself and your family in the event of an emergency.

Topics include:

- Determining your responsibility in preparing yourself and family for any type of emergency.
- Preparing your family with ready to go bags, emergency supply kits and determining whether to shelter and place or evacuate.
- Having emergency plans prepared and ready to go in the event of a disaster.
- Identify the impact you and your community can have on its ability to prepare for a potentially disastrous event.
- Learn how coordination and teamwork on all levels of government is needed in order to provide timely and appropriate information, training and protection to prepare for, respond to and recover from public health and disastrous events.

Time Frame

This course can be instructed in a one hour overview on emergency preparedness or a four hour in-depth look at disaster planning. Both the one hour and four hour courses are offered in a classroom setting. The four hour course is also available online. *Both of these courses can be customized to meet your personal or business needs.*

A minimum of 15 people required to schedule a training session.
