HSMI 146: "FAMILY AND COMMUNITY EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS"
Offered by the **Homeland Security Management Institute (HSMI)** of MCC

About HSMI:

The **mission** of the HSMI is to provide expertise in homeland security training to public and private employees and officials. As such, HSMI develops curricula, delivers program, broker resources, partners with agencies, and consults on issues of homeland security.

Through a network of community colleges, the HSMI provides regional and national services to safety professionals, public officials, healthcare providers, public safety managers and executives.

About This Course:

This course provides an overview of community preparedness and resilience, and it identifies both community and individual responsibilities prior to, during, and after a disastrous event.

Upon completion of this course, a community member should be able to:

1. Determine individual responsibilities in preparing for potentially disastrous events.
2. Identify the impact community engagement can have on a community's ability to prepare for a potentially disastrous event.
3. Describe the positive impact a community can make on the effectiveness of the first local first response efforts, public health initiatives, and local medical providers ability to meet the needs of the community.
4. Identify the factors that link business continuity, volunteerism and community resilience
5. Describe how a community can implement community preparedness education and lead the effort.
6. Relate community preparedness to the concept of community resilience.

This course is intended for general adult audiences and anyone who would volunteer to serve their community during a disastrous event.

This course is a self-paced, open entry/open exit course, meaning students can complete the course on their time without specific due dates or interaction with fellow students. However, an instructor monitors the course and requires students to complete simple online learning activities. The course is approximately 4 hours in duration.

Course Requirements: There are no pre-requisites or required background.

Time Frame: This course opens October 3, 2011, with 90 days to complete the course. Students may register for this course any time before May 28, 2012, and is open for approximately ninety (90) days once the student has started the session.

Fee: \$29.00 per student
