Each participant in the massage therapy program must have the ability, unaided or with the assistance of reasonable accommodation, to perform these Essential Functions. Reasonable accommodation is a modification or adjustment that enables an otherwise qualified individual with a disability to have an opportunity to attain the same level of performance or to enjoy equal benefits and privileges that are available to a similarly situated individual without a disability. A reasonable accommodation is defined on a case-by-case basis and must take into consideration:

1. The specific abilities and functional limitations of the individual
2. The specific functional requirements of the massage therapy program

Reasonable accommodations are directed toward providing an equal educational and/or employment opportunity for the disabled individual while providing for the safety of the individual, client, and agency staff.

Each participant in the massage therapy program, either unaided or with the assistance of reasonable accommodation, must be able to:

1. Carry out standard massage skills required by a licensed massage therapist such as, but not limited to, performing physical assessment and maintaining a sterile clinical setting.			
2. Manipulate equipment such as massage therapy tables and patients using gross motor skills.			
3. Execute massage therapy techniques requiring fine motor skills, gross motor skills, and the application of the sustained pressure using thumbs, wrists and hands.			
4. Communicate in an understandable manner a. verbally: person-to-person, over telecommunications devices b. in writing: longhand, by electronic/computer devices			
5. Interpret written, verbal and electronic communication accurately			
6. Maintain an alert level of consciousness and orientation to time, place and person at all times			
7. Maintain a level of functioning unimpaired by substances such as alcohol, prescription or illegal drugs.			
8. Demonstrates an ability to maintain professional conduct in the clinical setting
