

MONROE COMMUNITY COLLEGE

Monroe Community College was founded in 1961 as part of a state system of two-year colleges designed to provide technical, para-professional and university-parallel education. Today, MCC is one of 30 community colleges within the State University of New York. It is the largest community college upstate, with approximately 36,000 students enrolled in credit and non-credit programs.

MCC offers three types of programs: transfer, career and certificate. Transfer, or university-parallel, programs prepare MCC graduates to enter baccalaureate programs at four-year colleges and universities. Career programs prepare graduates to enter a specific employment field after graduation. Certificate programs are highly specialized, short-term programs. MCC offers 37 career programs – in business, communication, computers, health sciences, technologies, hospitality and criminal justice.

MCC's Brighton Campus is located on a 300-acre site just outside the city limits of Rochester, NY. The Damon City Campus is located in the heart of downtown Rochester.

MCC is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools. It is a board member of the League for Innovation in the Community College, a national consortium of colleges recognized for their innovative approaches to instruction and management.

DR. ALICE HOLLOWAY YOUNG

Dr. Alice Holloway Young has had a profound impact on education in Rochester and Monroe County over the last 50 years.

As a founding trustee of Monroe Community College, and as its chair from 1978 to 1998, she shaped the direction of the college and provided leadership that saw MCC become the premier institution it is today.

As an African-American educator in the Rochester City Schools for four decades, Dr. Young was a pioneer. She was among the first African-American teachers, and the first African-American to hold the titles of reading specialist, vice principal and principal. When Dr. Young retired in 1985, she held the position of supervising director of elementary instruction.

The Dr. Alice Holloway Young Internship gives ethnic underrepresented persons who are either graduate students or holders of graduate degrees an opportunity to gain experience teaching in a community college. It provides on-the-job training experiences, including teaching, course planning, student testing and evaluating, student advisement and related academic responsibilities.

Each Intern is assigned to a senior MCC faculty member, who serves as mentor.

A Dr. Alice Holloway Young Intern may teach one or two courses a semester, at the base salary for an adjunct instructor plus a small stipend. The Internship may be renewed for a second semester.

THE INTERNSHIP HAS TWO GOALS:

- To encourage talented underrepresented persons to consider a career in community college education;
- To enhance the education of MCC students by providing opportunities for them to learn from an ethnically-diverse faculty.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

To be considered for an Internship, you must have

- completed a bachelor's degree;
- completed at least 15 credits toward a master's degree in a discipline taught at Monroe Community College.

Applications are accepted on a continuous basis.
