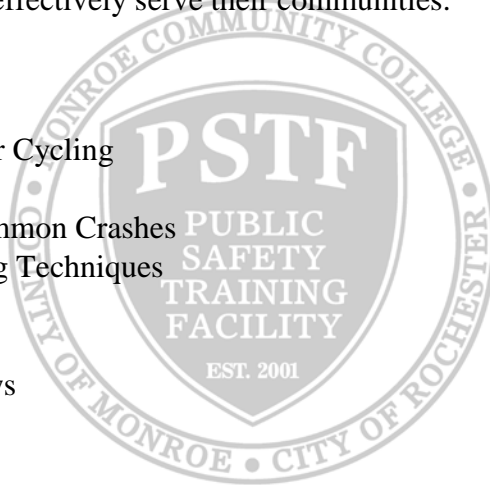

The Public Safety Training Center in partnership with the New York State Police will be conducting the DCJS certified **Law Enforcement Bicycle Patrol Course**. This five day course will be held on the above dates (*note the 3-11pm start on 6/6*) and times, room 101, at the Public Safety Training Center, 1190 Scottsville Rd., Rochester, New York.

Bicycle officers need to ride whenever and wherever they are needed. Proper training is essential to an officer's on-the-job performance, safety and reducing liability issues. The LE Bicycle Patrol Course provides bicycle officers with the skills they need to effectively serve their communities.

Topic Units:

- Bike Handling and Vehicular Cycling
- Bike Fit and Group Riding
- Hazard Recognition and Common Crashes
- Obstacle Clearing and Riding Techniques
- Nighttime Patrol Procedures
- Basic Maintenance
- Legal Issues and Traffic Laws
- Fitness and Nutrition
- Firearms



This course is **physically demanding**. Each day will include 20 miles of physically demanding riding. Students are required to complete this riding requirement. **Rain gear** is highly recommended, as students ride rain or shine.

Required Equipment:

- Cycling specific uniform (shirt, shorts, duty belt, cycling specific shoes or cross trainers)
- Body Armor
- ANSI/Snell approved helmet
- Padded cycling gloves
- Shatterproof eyewear with dark lenses for daytime and clear or yellow lenses for night riding.
- Bike specific multi-tool
- Patch kit
- 2 Tire levers
- Mini pump or CO2 inflators
- 2 Spare tubes
- Department issue, police specific mountain bike in good working order, with rear rack and patrol bag. An inspection will be done to ensure the bike is safe to ride. **Must have a functioning headlight and taillight system, and pedal retention devices (toe clips and straps)**

STUDENTS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO RIDE WITHOUT A SAFE BIKE AND ALL REQUIRED EQUIPMENT

Recommended Equipment:

- Water bottles
- Rain gear
- Sunscreen
- Padded cycling shorts for wear under patrol shorts (**highly recommended**)

Lead Instructor:

New York State Police Captain Neil Gallivan is a 24 year veteran and the Supervisor of Troop E Bike and Marine Patrol. He is a Police and EMS Cyclist Instructor certified by the International Police Mountain Bike Association and a DCJS certified Police Instructor. Captain Gallivan is also a NYS certified paramedic.

Successful completion of this course will be worth 2 college credits from Monroe Community College.

Tuition for this course is \$256.00 per person plus \$54.50 in student fees. *A certificate of residency from out-of-Monroe county residents is required in order to avoid double tuition billing.* You will be billed at the completion of the course. It will not be necessary to send a check or voucher prior to class.
