## Follow-Up Study of 2006 Graduates

The information in this study is based upon the responses of 1,239 graduates (48% response rate) of the Class of 2006.

### ❖ GRADUATES

2,574 MEMBERS OF THE CLASS OF 2006 WERE SURVEYED

- 1,703 (66%) HAD BEEN IN TRANSFER PROGRAMS

- 710 (28%) HAD BEEN IN CAREER PROGRAMS

- 161 (6%) HAD BEEN IN CERTIFICATE PROGRAMS

### ❖ TRANSFER PROGRAM GRADUATES

OF THE 850 (A.S./A.A.) GRADUATES RESPONDING:

- 577 (68%) ARE CONTINUING THEIR EDUCATION FULL-TIME

- 166 (20%) ARE EMPLOYED FULL-TIME

- 77 (9%) ARE CONTINUING THEIR EDUCATION OR ARE EMPLOYED PART-TIME

- 16 (2%) ARE CURRENTLY AVAILABLE FOR EMPLOYMENT

### ❖ CAREER PROGRAM GRADUATES

OF THE 331 (A.A.S.) GRADUATES RESPONDING:

- 213 (64%) ARE EMPLOYED FULL-TIME, 189 (57%) IN THEIR MAJOR FIELD

- 55 (17%) ARE CONTINUING THEIR EDUCATION FULL-TIME

- 46 (14%) ARE EMPLOYED OR ARE CONTINUING THEIR EDUCATION PART-TIME

- 12 (4%) ARE CURRENTLY AVAILABLE FOR EMPLOYMENT

### ❖ CAREER PROGRAM GRADUATES - CERTIFICATES
