Service-Learning Seminar SVL 101 (3 credit hours): Earn credit by performing meaningful services at not-for-profit organizations. Students serve for at least nine hours a week throughout the semester. Service-learners also attend a series of eight seminars that cover topics from citizenship development to what makes a community work. This course will be offered at the Damon City Campus and meets requirements for a Social Science elective.

Service-Learning courses give students an opportunity to bring their classroom learning to life while giving back to the Rochester community.

- ★ Diploma Distinction: Students who complete 200 hours of service with a 2.0 or better average receive a Seal of Distinction on their diploma

- ★ Strengthen problem-solving skills
- ★ Explore majors and career interests
