### PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Human Services A.S. degree program parallels the first two years of a bachelor's degree program and prepares you to transfer to a four-year institution in Social Work, Human Services, or a related area of study. Human Services/Social Work professionals serve clients at a wide variety of social organizations including child protection agencies, family counseling centers, hospitals, school, and probation departments.
