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AP Courses

More than 1,400 institutions in the United States, including Monroe Community College, recognize the rigor of Advanced Placement courses and award transfer credit to students who complete AP exams successfully.

The extra time and effort you devote to AP coursework in high school will pay off in college. You may be able to reduce the number of classes you need to take each semester or even graduate ahead of schedule. Most important, however, is that AP courses offer students an opportunity to challenge themselves and establish a solid foundation for college studies.

International Baccalaureate (IB) Courses

The International Baccalaureate Diploma was initially established in Switzerland in the late 1960's to enable students across Europe to transfer to schools within different countries and have their academic credit transfer seamlessly. In recent years, this program has become increasingly popular in secondary schools in the United States. Today more than 750 colleges in the United States, including Monroe Community College, award college transfer credit to IB diploma holders.

MCC will consider transfer credit for those students who have completed HL (Higher Level) courses and earned a grade of 4 or higher on a particular exam. Transfer credit evaluations will be done on a course-by-course basis by the Admissions Office. In order for students to earn a degree at MCC, at least 24 credits must be completed in residency.
