New Downtown Campus


From design through construction

Overview:

Monroe Community College is in the design phase of developing its new downtown campus on State Street and Morrie Silver Way. Our goal is to create a dynamic, collaborative, innovative, welcoming learning environment that matches the aspirations of our students and the needs of the local community. The project is on schedule and moving forward in partnership with Monroe County Department of Environmental Services.


All of the services and academic programs
— including law and criminal justice, human services, and education — currently located at the Damon City Campus will relocate to the new campus. Additionally, MCC's nationally recognized Division of Economic Development and Innovative Workforce Services will be housed on the seventh floor of the campus. The former Kodak Building 16, located on the corner of Morrie Silver Way and Plymouth Street, has been designated as available for businesses under Start-Up NY.





The new college campus will incorporate open, flexible spaces that foremost support student learning, maximize natural light, establish a street presence and welcome the community in order to strengthen the college's connection to Rochester.

An open stairway connecting the first three floors will create an energetic and welcoming environment for current students, prospective students and the community.
