

## Video shows the planned MCC building downtown

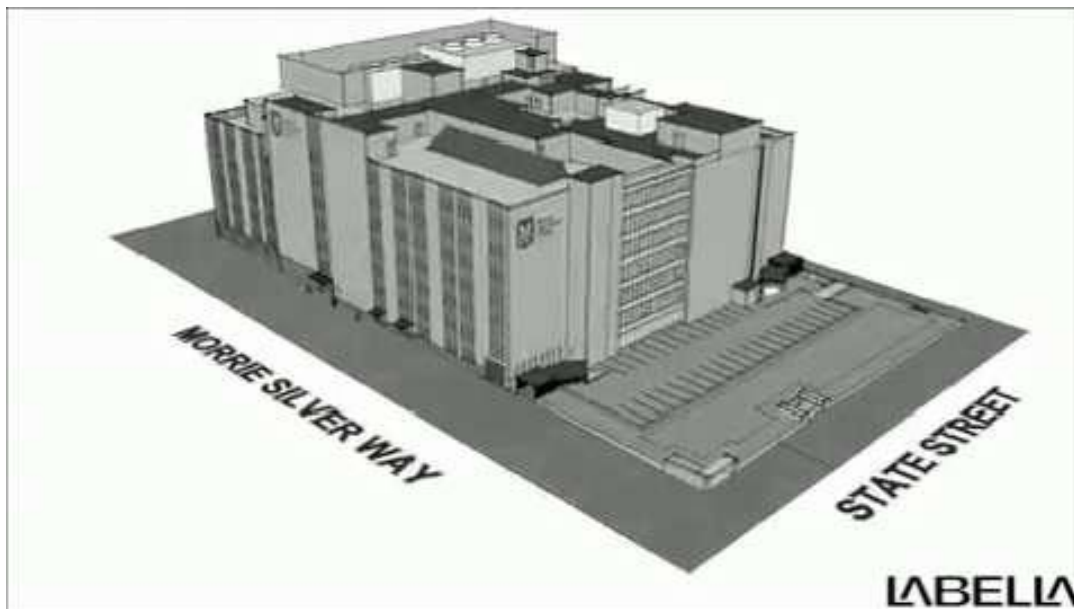

Monroe Community College officials released a video animation of what the new downtown campus will look like, inside and out.

The 3-minute, 31-second video starts with a birds eye view of the building planned for a parcel on the corner of State Street and Morrie Silver Way. It goes on to show the interior of the building from several angles.

Construction on the \$72 million project is about to start and the building should be ready for use in the summer of 2017.

The video animation was shown Wednesday during remarks by Monroe County Executive Maggie Brooks at the annual Vision-Future luncheon presented by the Rochester Downtown Development Corp. and the Rochester Rotary Club at the Floreano Riverside Convention Center.

Brooks listed the new MCC campus as one example of many projects underway in downtown Rochester.

All of the services and academic programs currently located at the Damon City Campus in the Sibley Building will move to the new campus.

MCC's Division of Economic Development and Innovative Workforce Services will be located on the seventh floor of the campus. And a portion of the space is designated as available for businesses under the START-UP NY tax incentive program.
