I believe my experience aligns very well with the Assistant Vice President's responsibilities and that my creativity, energy, commitment to student success, and desire for professional and personal growth would make me an excellent fit.

Throughout my career, I have worked to provide access and equity in education through programs such as EOP, CSTEP, McNair, and TRIO Student Support Services. It has long been a goal of mine to move into the community college sector, a place where students undergo amazing personal and professional transformation. My research into MCC shows an institution with a clear sense of mission and goals and a well-articulated strategic plan for making those goals a reality. In support of the College's goals, I believe I bring a set of experiences to the Student Success team that is both wide and deep. These include:

Created a Lead Advisor training model overseen by representatives of all three schools at the college. Formulated a plan for assessment of advising.
- Collaborative leader with experience in Residence Life; Student Affairs; Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion; Academic Affairs; Student Services; and the Research Foundation of SUNY.
- More than 15 years of grant management experience with state and federal programs as well as private foundations. Secured and managed over \$5 million in funding. Consistently exceeded grant goals and outcomes.

- Member of college-wide strategic planning committees for Enrollment Management, Academic Affairs, and DEI. Member of the steering committees for the Facilities Master Plan and for the multi-year Middle States Accreditation process.
- Creation and administration of successful high-impact supports such as Academic Support Recitations for high-DFW courses, Peer Academic Coaches, the Northbound Peer Orientation and Transition Mentors, professional Academic Mentors, First-Year Seminars, early alerts, campus-wide advising workshops, and the transition of a range of college processes to an online environment.
- Supervision of a diverse group of professional, administrative, and student staff.
 Responsible for ongoing training and professional development as well as annual evaluation of UUP, CSEA, and Research Foundation employees.
- Member of the college's Behavioral Evaluation Committee to address student wellness emergencies.
- Currently charged with managing strategic projects for the Provost including review and revitalization of tutoring services, academic mentoring, and tutoring services.
