Scholarship will be awarded at the College-wide Scholarship Award Ceremony scheduled for Mid-May 2019

## **Eligibility Requirements**

- 1. Open to any student enrolled in Monroe Community College <u>that is returning as a FULL-TIME Student</u> (12+ Credit Hours) for the **Fall 2020/Spring 2021** School Year.
- Students <u>do not</u> need to have been in the MVP Train-the-Trainer Program Workshop already, but<u>do</u> need to express their specific commitment to violence prevention while answering to (below) ESSAY TOPIC.
- Selection of the winners will be decided by the MVP Team and will be <u>based upon the essay review</u>.
  a. Other factors that will be taken into consideration include: skill and ability, initiative, eagerness to learn, discretion, maturity, and flexibility.

- Essay must be between **500** and **1,000 words**.
- Essay must be in Times New Roman font size 12. (Double-line spacing is NOT needed.)
