Peer Assistant Network Training (PANT) is a comprehensive student development training program. During this training, students will explore and develop interpersonal, professional, and leadership skills that allow them to grow into exceptional student leaders. The program is designed to help Peer Leaders gain specific knowledge about college policies and procedures, academic programs, co-curricular activities and organizations, and student life which will enable the Peer Leader to effectively and professionally assist the MCC student population. This is a paid training program.

Fall 2019/Spring 2020 Peer Leader Assignments

Peer Leaders will be assigned to specific Student Services areas based on their interests, skills, and availability. Assigned hours will vary during the Summer, Fall, and Spring semesters. Please note, hours will be assigned based on the needs of the Student Services Department. Some weeks you may not be assigned any work hours due to slow student traffic, however, during busy times you may be asked to work more hours.

In addition, individual hours will be based on individual assignments and approval of area supervisors. Field Work/Internship, Federal Work-Study, and Vocational Education/Work Experience Program (V-WEP) requirements and budgets may also impact the number of hours assigned to each individual.

Student Engagement Resource Center- Peer Leaders assist with schedule building and online registration in the SERC and during special registration programs.

Student Engagement Center- Peer Leaders assist staff with distributing information to new and returning students. Peer Leaders will be required to be familiar with college policies and procedures, and have an interest in customer service for this position.

Enrollment and Financial Services- Peer Leaders assist staff with FAFSA filing workshops and other day to day operations.

First Year Experience (FYE)- FYE is a comprehensive program joining both academic and co-curricular activities to promote the successful transition of new students to college life. Peer Leaders will assist new students in navigating their first year at MCC.

Wellness Center and Food Pantry- Peer Leaders will assist with programming designed to improve the health and wellness of students, staff, and faculty on the Downtown Campus.

Other Activities- These include Drop/Add assistance, Peer Leader recruitment activities, campus tours, telephone campaigns, and Peer Leader community service activities. Additional activities may be scheduled as needed.
