Dear Pencils and Paper Donor,

I wanted to take a moment to thank you for the supplies. I cannot even begin to explain how appreciated they are and how thankful I am. I am currently a reading teacher in the Rochester City School District. I work with students who are struggling readers. I work with about 40 students every day. If I am lucky and there is money left over in the school budget I get \$50 to spend each year to purchase supplies to use with all of these students. As you can guess this does not even come close to covering what I need. I do not have any students bring supplies with them at the beginning of the year because I am a supplemental resource and most times these students cannot even afford to bring supplies for their classroom.

I have a 3rd grader and a preschooler of my own. My 3rd graders school supplies have averaged about \$60 per year and that is with teachers having a classroom budget of around \$300 to spend on their supplies. My preschooler's supplies were about \$20 this year. In addition to purchasing my own children's supplies I have to purchase for my class. I typically spend \$200-300 a year on supplies (pencils, crayons, markers, dry erase markers, construction paper, notebooks, binders, etc). That does not include the books and other supplemental materials I purchase during the year. Being able to go to Pencils and Paper and receive so many of those supplies for free has allowed me to use the money I saved to purchase other things for my room that I have not been able to (seat sacks, organizational materials).

I brought the supplies to school the day after going to Pencils and Paper. I laid many of the materials out for the students to see. They were beyond excited and so surprised that people would be so kind as to give us supplies to help in their learning venture. It may seem silly, but just from having a new set of crayons, pencil, eraser, markers they have a renewed excitement when working in reading group. They are very excited for the reading crafts we are going to be able to create. They checked with me every day to see if I had mailed out their thank you cards because they wanted everyone to know how appreciative they were. I was very excited to see there were also supplies like a stapler, hole punch, folders, etc.

It is so wonderful to have Pencils and Paper in the Rochester area to support our students and support us as we support our students. It is no secret that schools with a high percentage of students living in poverty often do not have the same resources available to them as schools with a minimal amount of students living in poverty. All that has been provided to me through Pencils and Paper has helped close that gap. I am very grateful.
