NYS Upstate Louis Stokes Alliance for Minority Participation (ULSAMP) focuses on assisting Under-Represented Minority (URM) students into science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) programs of study and careers. The primary opportunity for growth in the STEM workforce rests on attracting and preparing outstanding students from all racial and ethnic groups. At the College, ULSAMP and the Collegiate Science and Technology Entry Program (CSTEP) are co-administered. Through ULSAMP, students participate in summer research experiences for undergraduate (REU) students and in internship opportunities. Incoming freshmen ULSAMP students participate in a five-week CSTEP Summer Bridge program that prepares them for successful entry and acclimation to the College.
