**Detail of Teaching/Research Interests:** The course aims to stimulate discussion among students of the Dentistry Course from different cultures regarding preventive measures, diagnosis and treatment of alveolar trauma, based on current IADT recommendations.

This activity will be developed within the discipline of Integrated Clinic, Course of Dentistry, Faculty of Dentistry, Campus of Araçatuba-UNESP. It is possible with a number of 10 to 15 students, among whom they voluntarily apply to participate in the care of patients who have suffered dental trauma. A period of 5 weeks is appropriate to develop the proposed activities, with possible dates from August to November.

Students will have the opportunity to turn knowledge into action to achieve their desired performance; practical training, cognitive and socio-emotional skills by doing case analysis.

**COIL Course Idea:** The focus of the content is practical, based on case analysis. The treatment plan for the dental trauma cases that will be discussed may differ due to the culture, structure, care organization and socioeconomic status.

- Task1. Getting to know one another. Each member of the group introduces herself / himself in the
  context of the way they learn and practice the dental trauma cases. Also, together they design a file
  with pictures and text, comparing their differences and common points comparing with IADT
  guideline. Groupwork: oral and written.
- Task2. Exchange about the life style of the population, selecting the main points related to the etiological factor for the dental trauma, and compare what is common and different in the group. Groupwork: oral and written
- Task3. Exchange about IADT guideline and choice of treatment by the patient (i.e. implant use, time
  of treatment, price of treatment), and compare what is common and different in the group.
  Groupwork: oral and written
- Task4. Exchange about how is dental trauma cases conducted (First help-who and where is it done? Is there referral of cases for their continuity of treatment? Where?), And compare what is common and different in the group. Groupwork: oral and written
- Task5. Make the treatment plan for clinical cases and indication of future research to improve the prognosis of these cases. Groupwork: oral and written
