After taking a poll of who would be attending, it was agreed not to change the meeting.

3. Approval of the Minutes

4. Action Items:

a) Curriculum: Program Deactivation: Liberal Arts And Sciences: Humanities And Social Science (A.A.) 2016-PD3 Spring

E. Putnam presented the Program Deactivation for Liberal Arts And Sciences: Humanities And Social Science (AA).

Rationale:

Per the recommendations of the Liberal Arts Council, the college will be incorporating all elements of this degree into the LA04 General Studies, including completion of General Education requirements. There are currently a small number of students in this program (20-25). The English/Philosophy department currently offers three AA degrees.

There was no discussion. Passed.

b) Faculty Senate Response to President Kress/Dr. Wade request re: Right to Return

A. Colosimo reviewed the draft memo.

Motion to approve the memorandum as written. Motion seconded. Discussion: No discussion.

c) NEG: Faculty Senate Election Proposal (Option 2)

M. Heel explained the Faculty Senate consensus at the April 13 Faculty Senate meeting was to move forward with the 1/2 loaf option regarding the election process: Senator elections in May and Officers election in June. In order to move forward there will need to be a vote to temporarily suspend the rules outlined in the Faculty Senate Resolution.

M. Heel made a motion to temporarily suspend Faculty Senate Resolutions 6.1.2 (2-4) and 6.1.4 (1-2) as they pertain to the timing of elections.

Motion seconded.

d) Proposed Academic Freedom Policy

M. Redlo tabled the vote on the proposed Academic Freedom Policy. A. Colosimo explained she provided Dr. Wade with the feedback that the Faculty Senate would unlikely approve the proposed Academic Freedom Policy as written until the concerns of the Faculty Association have been addressed. B. Gizzi confirmed she met with Dr. Wade to address the issues. Dr. Wade indicated she would forward an edited version to the FS and FA for review.

a) NEG: Proposed amendment to Faculty Senate Resolution 6

M. Heel presented the proposed amendment to Faculty Senate Resolution 6. He reviewed the proposed changes and provided the following summary:

- Majority of the changes is aligning the language with the FS Bylaws

- Updating the sections regarding the representative for the FCCC and MCC Association Board pointing out the major changes

The documents will be sent out to Senators for review and to obtain any feedback from constituents. He explained the proposed revision will be voted on at the May 18 Faculty Senate meeting. emphasizing the importance of the vote since it addresses the timing of the elections. He pointed out the amendments to the Faculty Senate Resolution do not need to be approved by the Board of

Trustees.

b) Proposed Cyber Awareness and Education Policy

A. Colosimo explained E. Wirley will be attending the May 11 Executive Committee to discuss the proposed policy. She encouraged Senators and their constituents to forward any additional feedback to her.

Thank you for your email to the Faculty Senate on March 28, 2017 requesting input from the Faculty Senate on MCC's hiring policy for Faculty with rank and tenure into administrative positions. The Faculty Senate respectfully offers these recommendations:

For Internal Hires:

- That the Board of Trustees and Administration honor the decades-long practice of allowing MCC Faculty who have earned tenure at the College and are subsequently hired into administrative positions, to retain the right to return with pre-established tenure and rank to the department or office from which tenure was earned. There is a mutual understanding between the Board and employee that tenure is unrelated to the employee's administrative position.
- That the Board of Trustees and Administration honor the same right to return with tenure and rank should the employee or Administration choose, at any time during the employee's administrative service, to leave the non-contract administrative position and return to the department or office from which tenure was earned.
- That the Board of Trustees honor the established contractual proviso regarding alternative training in the event that upon return, no position is available for the employee within that department or office.

For External Hires:

- That the Board of Trustees and Administration honor the established national practice, as described in the AAUP's 1940 Statement on Principles of Academic Freedom and Tenure with 1970 Interpretive Comments, that defines tenure as institution-specific and non-transferable for both teaching faculty and administrative positions unless negotiated by the external candidates.
- That the Board of Trustees and Administration, as part of the standard hiring discussions associated with external candidates for non-contract positions regarding salary and benefits of employment, adopt the common national industry practice of making decisions regarding the possibility of tenure on a case-by-case basis, as detailed in the aforementioned AAUP statement.

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The rationale for these recommendations is outlined in the Faculty Senate's recently approved resolution, *The Right to Return Policy*. Thank you for your continued dedication to the principles of shared governance in seeking these recommendations.
