What's New in Degree Works

(Note, unless otherwise specified, the following **New** changes will only take effect in Degree Works for programs that have been revised for 2018-19. Programs for which there has not been a revision or that have not received final approval will display the **Current** format.)

1. Split Credits

Current: Degree Works allows "excess" credits from a course to "split" and be used toward a general elective, liberal arts elective, or in Liberal Arts-General Studies, a Math/Natural Science elective. For instance, if a student takes a 4-credit Math course to satisfy a 3-credit Math requirement, the "extra" credit "splits" and is available to use toward one of these electives.

New: We have learned that this practice is out of compliance with the curriculum as approved by SUNY and SED and in conflict with Middle States requirements. As such, we will be ending this practice. Starting the 2018-19 academic year, NO courses will split credits in Degree Works.

2. Semester Headings
