

Guided Pathways Mindset Shifts

FROM:	TO:
Transfer vs. CTE, credit vs. non-credit	→ Career-connected transfer paths or livable-wage job w/ clear degree path
Full-time vs. part-time	→ On-plan vs. off-plan
Job/transfer support for near completers	→ Career/transfer exploration and planning for <u>all students</u> from the start
Standardized placement tests	→ Multiple measures and in-class diagnostic assessment
Pre-requisite remediation	→ Integrated/contextualized academic support
Algebra and English comp “gatekeepers”	→ Critical program courses (including field-appropriate math)
In-class vs. co-curricular	→ Program-relevant active/experiential learning




Medical Administration and Support Services




- Counsel clients in individual or group sessions to assist them in dealing with substance abuse, mental or physical illness, poverty, unemployment, or physical abuse.


National Education Attainment Level

Living wage

Living Wage Calculation for Monroe County, New York

The living wage shown is the hourly rate that an **individual** in a household must earn to support his or herself and their family. The assumption is the sole provider is working full-time (2080 hours per year). The tool provides information for individuals, and households with one or two working adults and zero to three children. In the case of households with two working adults, all values are **per working adult, single or in a family** unless otherwise noted.

The state minimum wage is the same for all individuals, regardless of how many dependents they may have. Data are updated annually, in the first quarter of the new year. State minimum wages are determined based on the posted value of the minimum wage as of January one of the coming year (National Conference of State Legislatures, 2019). The poverty rate reflects a person's gross annual income. We have converted it to an hourly wage for the sake of comparison.



“Ask” is more than a question - it is an iterative, ongoing conversation and developmental process to help students explore their interests, recognize their strengths, and identify educational and career paths that align with those interests and strengths.

- Intake surveys
- Career assessments

- New Student
 - 1. What excites you about your major and going to college?
 - 2. What are your educational and career goals?

- Continuing Student
 - 1. How are your current classes going? How did your last semester go?
 - 2. What is one highlight or thing that impacted your semester positively?
 - 3. How do you feel about where you are today and your progress?



Connect

“Connect” is about helping students connect with others in their program area, including not only faculty, advisors, and other staff members, but also peers, alumni, and employers.

- Program and field showcase events
- School specialists
- gives students real world insight into programs and careers to help them make an informed decision about their path
- facilitates a sense of belonging
- provides an opportunity for students to start building an academic and professional network




Inspire

“Inspire” is about “lighting the fire” for learning and getting students excited both about their program and about being in college.

- Program-relevant courses for students in first term
- Service learning and project-based learning
- Active learning and co-curricular experiences
- TCC – professional learning for faculty

- Facilitates exploration of interests
- Exposes students to foundational concepts, theories, and information about a discipline
- Provides hands-on learning experience relevant to career goals
- Gives faculty an opportunity to “sell” a program of study
- Demonstrates the value of investing in higher education



Plan

“Plan” is about creating a process for helping every student make a complete, individualized program plan.

- Built to cover the entire program through completion or transfer
- Based on standard program map but customized for each student
- Easily accessible
- Embedded assignment in College Success courses

- students know where their program leads, what courses they need to take, and how long it will take to complete
- advisors and faculty can monitor students’ progress and intervene if necessary to keep students on track


