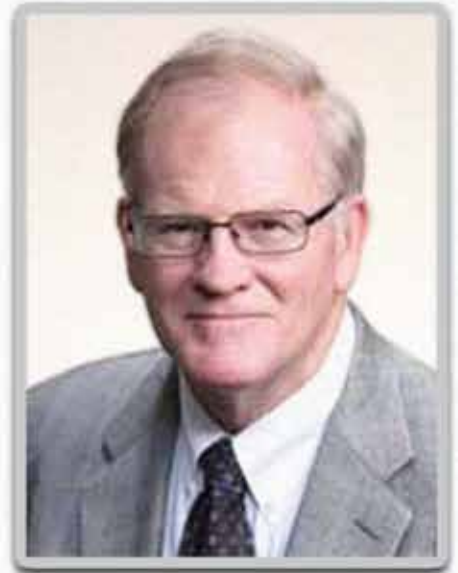


Wage Theft

A conversation with Attorney Michael T. Harren

Michael Harren, Esq. is a lawyer who has practiced employment law for 45 years. His focus is on rights of unions and workers. Among the issues he addresses are fair pay, discrimination, wrongful termination, contract negotiations and employee benefits.



What is wage theft?

Wage theft covers a variety of infractions that occur when workers do not receive their legally or contractually promised wages. Take for example:

- Overtime pay
- Payment after a worker leaves a job
- When does minimum wage become important?
- What unfair practices happen without you (the worker) knowing about it?

Most commonly wage theft is a violation of the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) which provides for a federal minimum wage and allows states to set their own (higher) minimum wage, and requires employers to pay time and a half for all hours worked above 40 hours per week.
