NURSING



Changes to the Nursing Admission Criteria

- **New application date for Spring 2020 – September 30, 2019.** (Admission notification will be sent by October 31, 2019.) All transcripts from previous colleges are required to be on file by September 30th. Students enrolled in fall classes will have access to the online major change request form in mid-September. Please note that there will be a very short window of time to submit your request; we will send an email when it is available. Students who are not attending in the fall will need to reapply to the College by September 30th.
- 2.75 cumulative GPA required, including all credit bearing coursework at previous colleges.
- In addition to the four (4) points for applicants with a Bachelor's degree, applicants with a Master's degree by the application deadline date will be awarded one (1) additional point.
- Students with two (2) unsuccessful attempts in Anatomy & Physiology coursework (BIO 142, 143, 144, and 145) within the past seven (7) years are ineligible to apply. This includes attempts at previous institutions.
- In the past, BIO 142 never expired and therefore unsuccessful attempts were still included. BIO 142 is now excluded after seven (7) years.



DENTAL HYGIENE



Changes to the Dental Hygiene Admission Criteria and Curriculum

- Students with two (2) unsuccessful attempts in Anatomy & Physiology coursework (BIO 134, 135, 142, 143, 144, and 145) within the past seven (7) years are ineligible to apply. This includes attempts at previous institutions.
- Advisement note – pending curriculum changes, SPC 143 will NOT be included in the Dental Hygiene program. Therefore, please consider taking SPC 141 or 144. In addition, math may be removed from the program requirements. Students will still need the minimum math prerequisite to apply.

Dental Assisting and Hygiene Biology sequence options

- DA01 to DH01 application, pros/cons
- DART is an online option for individuals seeking dental assistant licensure. They already work at a dental office as an assistant; the dentist acts as the preceptor. It is not aid eligible and does not provide points for DH01 admission.
- BIO 134/135 vs. 144/145
 - Can take BIO 134 without CHE prereq, but will still need CHE 100 for program prereq
 - 85% of Fall 2019 admits took BIO 144/145



SURGICAL TECHNOLOGY



Changes to the Surgical Technology Admission Criteria and Curriculum

- Students with two (2) unsuccessful attempts in Anatomy & Physiology coursework (BIO 142, 143, 144, and 145) within the past seven (7) years are ineligible to apply. This includes attempts at previous institutions.
- In the past, BIO 142 never expired and therefore unsuccessful attempts were still included. BIO 142 is now excluded after seven (7) years.
- Advisement note – SOC 101 is included in the Surg Tech program instead of PSY 101.

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RADIOLOGIC TECHNOLOGY



Changes to the Radiologic Technology Admission Criteria and Curriculum

- 2.75 cumulative GPA required, including all credit bearing coursework at previous colleges
- Students with two (2) unsuccessful attempts in the first half of Anatomy & Physiology coursework (BIO 142 and 144) within the past seven (7) years are ineligible to apply. This includes attempts at previous institutions.
- Advisement note – pending curriculum changes, please consider the following courses:
 - Humanities requirements – ENG 101/200 and SPC 141
 - Social Science requirements – HEG 215 (PSY 101 will be removed)
 - Math requirements – MTH 165 or higher; do not take MTH 160
 - Science requirements – BIO 144 and 145 (only BIO 144 is included in quality points)
- Fall 2020 points will only be based on three classes: ENG 101 or 200, BIO 144, MTH 165 or higher. PSY 101 will NOT be included in the quality point tally, since it will most likely be removed from the program.

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Clinical Lab Tech

Clinical Lab Technician Curriculum Changes

- Can take PHL 250 Professional Ethics instead of PHL 103 Intro to Ethics if desired.
- MCC-SD elective now SUNY OWC or WC
- Remove BIO 202 (needed content will be covered in new CLT course)

What counts as an unsuccessful attempt?

- For any Anatomy/Physiology course, a grade of C- or below or a withdrawal (W), count as unsuccessful attempts. This includes attempts at previous institutions; all transcripts are required.
- Unsuccessful attempts expire after 7 years. This “rule” is different for each individual institution – students need to contact other institutions for their policies.
- BIO 142 Anatomy and 143 Physiology are the old sequence of courses. Students enrolled now take BIO 144 Anatomy & Physiology I and 145 Anatomy and Physiology II.

Why do we advise on curriculum changes that haven't been approved yet?

- Students are only “grandfathered” into a curriculum if they are IN the program at the time it changes. If they are on the pathway, but not in the program, they have to adhere to requirements at the time they matriculate into the program.
- DW doesn't reflect changes until they are fully approved
- You can view changes and their status in the Curriculum database
- Example: Rad Tech changes

TEAS testing for the Nursing program

- Anticipated start date - for Spring 2021 admission
- Points awarded based on score; these points will be added to the quality point total for ranking purposes. Exact scores and point values to be determined.
 - Example: 30 points for score of 93% - 100%, 2 points for score of 62% - 65.9%

How is GPA calculated for selection?

How are points calculated?

- Cumulative GPA's are calculated - including coursework at other institutions
 - Non-credit coursework is not included
 - Excluded coursework is not included (repeated or Fresh Start)
 - AP/IB is not included, but dual credit is
- GPA calculator on Degree Works
- Quality point calculator in myMCC (Students tab, My Account, Academic Advising box)
 - Note: this is only a tool. It does not pull in GPA or unsuccessful attempts from previous institutions.

Course Sequences

- BIO 145 and 202 can now be taken at the same time
- Chemistry is strongly recommended as a pre-req to BIO 144, but is not hard-coded in banner, so students are allowed to register for it at the same time as or before Chemistry.
- Chem is a pre-req for most competitive health programs.

What happened to LA05 and why are many competitive health pathway students in Health Studies now?

- LA05 was the old way of identifying liberal arts students interested in health programs. Now that we have pathways we can identify exactly the health program a student is interested in, thus making LA05 a redundancy.
- Health Studies – Clinical Track (HS03) was created and is constantly updated to help support competitive health-related program interest students (especially Nursing). It provides better course selection guidance than Liberal Arts.
