## DEVELOPMENT

## Alumni

- Hosted Lou Gramm '71, accomplished musician, song writer and lead singer of the iconic band Foreigner, on Saturday, May 24, at Monroe Community College. Billed as "An Evening with Lou Gramm," over 300 were in attendance and received autographed copies of Gramm's autobiography. A portion of each ticket sold, a total of $\$ 1,525$, was donated to the Annual Fund for Monroe Community College. Richard Warshof welcomed the audience and Lou Gramm to the stage. Gramm is a 1971 graduate of MCC and a charter member of the college's Alumni Hall of Fame.
- Alumni Hall of Fame 2013 call for nominations came to a close on June 1. We will consider 35 qualified nominations for possible induction into the MCC Alumni Hall of Fame.

Annual Fund
