II. SPEAK TO THE SENATE

Malcolm Cohen reported that the SUNY Assembly Spring Conference will be held on April 16th through 18th at Saratoga Springs, New York. There will be a school spirit contest, judged by Chancellor Zimpher, and also a weekend long silent auction. The Chancellor will also be conducting a launch event for their new strategic plan entitled, "The Power of SUNY." It is specifically geared toward SUNY students and only open to conference participants.

He then handed out an outline of the Executive Committee's resolutions for this week's business meeting agenda. The first resolution is to make the Director of Community College Affairs a permanent position. The second is to clean up the By-laws, in order to make it easier to remove misbehaving cabinet members. The third is to make the Director of Environmental Affairs a permanent cabinet position. The fourth is to endorse the Nutrition Outreach and Education Program, which is sponsored by Hudson Valley Community College.

Elections will be held this weekend for four e-board positions. After these positions are elected, they will be holding elections for 15 representatives.

On April 27th, there will be a Rochester area launch of their strategic plan to be held at MCC at 10:00 am. He encouraged all to attend.

1. ACTION ITEMS (Items requiring a Senate vote)

a. <u>Resolution to approve funding to the Engineering Leadership Council for the amount of money</u> presented by the Finance Committee member.

Resolved, that the Brighton Campus Student Government Association Senate approves the funding to the Engineering Leadership Council for the amount of money presented by Finance Committee member.

Senator Monroe stated that the Finance Committee reviewed the resolution to approve the amount of \$7,730.50, to the Engineering Leadership Council, but the Senate Contingency Fund contains only \$2,229.20. Therefore, the Finance Committee is recommending that the amount of \$2,229.20 be approved for the Engineering Leadership Council.

Discussion:

David Pashina, President of the Engineering Leadership Council, explained that they requested this money for their yearly regional TYESA Competition. They hope to defend their state championship. He would appreciate any consideration given to this matter.

A vote was taken.

Be it resolved, the Monroe Community College Brighton Campus Student Government Association Senate unanimously approves the amount of \$2,229.20 to the Engineering Leadership Council presented by the Finance Committee member.

b. <u>Resolution to approve members to the Media Committee</u>

Resolved, that the Brighton Campus Student Government Association Senate consents to the appointment of Douglas Moorefield, as Committee Chair., and Christoper Hollander, Elli Kuhn,

Anelyse Wojick, Nate Moore and Madasyn Czebiniak members of the Media Committee for the remainder of the 2009-2010 academic school year.

Speaker Ruhindi called for a motion to approve committee members.

Senator Carey so moved, seconded by Senator Monroe.

Corey Kesselring, *Nate Moore*, who was representing Anelyse Wojick, stated that the purpose of their group is to unite the media portions of the clubs and organizations at MCC. They also want to create events and details to connect all the clubs at MCC for a more synergetic experience between clubs.

Senator Hollander stated that he felt creating a committee for this purpose was an excellent idea. Deputy Speaker Moorefield read a statement of support from Madasyn Czebiniak, Editor of the Monroe Doctrine, regarding the forming of a Media Committee.
