VIII. EXECUTIVE SESSION

Resolution to approve the Constitutional amendments for Phi Theta Kappa

Whereas Article I subsection Amendments to an Existing Constitution states: Any club or organization desiring any changes or amendments to their constitution must apply to the Senate through the Director of the Office of Student Life and Leadership Development. And,

Whereas the Phi Theta Kappa honor society has amended their constitution under Article IV. Section 2. Eligibility Requirements to read B. Have a cumulative grade point average of 3.60 or higher. Grades in courses taken over five years ago need not be counted in cumulative GPA if they reduce GPA below 3.60. And,

Whereas this change will allow those students who have succeeded in maintaining a high grade point average during their time as Monroe Community College to become members of Phi Theta Kappa. And,

Whereas the previous grade point average requirement was 3.75. And,

Whereas the national standard for joining Phi Theta Kappa is a grade point average of 3.5, thus the 3.6 average would still be above the national average. Be it,

Resolved that the senate present and voting accept the amendment to the Phi Theta Kappa constitution.
