Call for Dialogues

The biennial Seneca Falls Dialogues (SFD) are a collaborative effort to reinvigorate Seneca Falls as a site of feminist activism and intellectual exchange.

We are seeking group-led sessions that involve active audience participation and focused discussion of issues raised by the conference themes. Session proposals should indicate how organizers will present information, pose questions, and facilitate conversation.

All proposals must include the following:

- Title of the session.
- A 2-3 sentence summary of its focus and relevance to one or more of the conference themes.
- Name of each session organizer.
- Name of one organizer who will serve as the contact person. Include for the contact person her or his home or institutional address, email, and telephone number.
- 250-500 word description of the session's focus and organization. This should include how the organizers will introduce the topic, questions they will pose and a clear explanation of how the organizers will involve the audience in dialogue.

Conference participants will be invited to submit essay versions of their dialogues for inclusion in the inaugural on-line *Seneca Falls Dialogues Journal*.
