Everyone plays a role in the catastrophic failure of urban schools, but there is a way out.

Nicole "Nykki" McCawthan is proof of that. A decade ago, as she was about to enter the city's John Marshall High School, she was recruited to the Upward Bound program that gives low-income students whose parents did not attend college the tools to achieve academic success and, more important, the belief that success is theirs for the taking.

"When I was growing up," she says, "no one ever used the 'C-word.'" College was not in the cards. Upward Bound changed that. A federally funded program, Upward Bound provides eligible students with extensive tutoring and Saturday classes in math, literature, science, writing and foreign language. Upward Bound tutors help students search for colleges and financial aid, and provide college visits to give them a taste of the life to come.

The program surrounds kids who can barely imagine life beyond Avenue D or Jefferson Avenue with a world of possibilities. They learn how to study, to believe in themselves, to step outside their comfort zones.
