Resolution for Tuition Increase

Whereas, under the preamble of the Damon Student Events and Governance Association, SEGA is charged with promoting the general welfare of the student body and providing a means through which the student body may voice its wishes on matters which directly concern it, and

Whereas, Monroe Community College Board of Trustee member John Parrinello has proposed a tuition increase double of what was accepted by the Damon Student Events and Governance Association at the public meeting on April 8, 2011, and *Whereas*, SEGA unanimously approved a \$50/semester increase for resident, full-time students, and a \$4/credit hour increase for resident, full-time students, and a \$4/credit hour increase for non-resident part-time students, in a resolution on April 8, 2011, and

Whereas, SEGA understands a rational tuition increase is necessary during unfavorable economic times, but it still allows this college to maintain its commitment of providing accessible and quality education, and

Whereas, the Board of Trustees have voted to table the tuition increase until the June meeting, and

Whereas, the Monroe Community College Board of Trustees have already approved an increase in the technology fee by 67% for full-time students during the 2011-2012 academic year, be it

Resolved, the Damon Student Events and Governance Association will not accept any tuition increase greater than \$50/semester for resident, full-time students, and \$4/credit hour for resident, part-time students, and \$100/semester for non-resident, full-time students, and \$8/credit hour for non-resident part-time students, and furthermore, be it

Resolved, the Damon Student Events and Governance Association charges the Board of Trustees to utilize the fund balance to make-up any shortfalls in the budget.

A motion was made by Mr. Carey and seconded by Mr. Berg to approve the resolution as amended. Motion approved.

Resolution for Funding of Monroe Community College by Sponsor County

Whereas, under the preamble of the Damon Student Events and Governance Association, SEGA is charged with promoting the general welfare of the student body and providing a means through which the student body may voice its wishes on matters which directly concern it, and

Whereas, Monroe Community College is seeking additional funding of \$1.2 million from Monroe County, and

Whereas, Monroe Community College is charged by Monroe County to collect parking fees and distribute those funds to the County, and

Whereas, Monroe County sets the parking fees, be it

Resolved, the Damon Student Events and Governance Association demands the additional funding of \$1.2 million to MCC, and furthermore, be it

Resolved, the Damon Student Events and Governance Association would find any increase in parking fees irresponsible and unacceptable to the student body in order to fund the \$1.2 million increase in County sponsorship of the college.

A motion was made by Mr. Carey and seconded by Ms. Ginevra to approve the resolution as amended. Motion approved.
