

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August 29th is the final day to register for fall classes

A new registration deadline for full-time students will be in effect for the fall 2011 semester. To register, a student must have already applied, and been accepted, to MCC by the August 29th deadline.

"We want to give students every advantage to succeed academically," says MCC's Director of Admissions, Andy Freeman. "That includes having enough time to receive academic advising, to take any necessary placement testing, and to be notified of financial aid awards that help pay for their tuition and books."

A few dates to help students meet MCC's August registration deadline.

• Apply for Financial Aid by May 20th

Waiting to file for financial aid after May 20th will jeopardize whether a student receives notification of awards in time to help pay tuition, which is required for registration. Of course, the sooner students apply after March 31st, the better their chances of being considered for all available aid.

• Apply for Admission by August 1st

To ensure that all paperwork is received and processed in time to be accepted for the fall semester, students should send a completed application (via traditional mail or online) no later than this date.


