By 2020, 65 percent of all jobs in the U.S. economy will require postsecondary education and training beyond high school; 35 percent of job openings will require at least a bachelor's degree.\* Each year, the majority of MCC students, approximately 70 percent, transfer to four-year colleges and universities. Because of MCC's transfer and dual enrollment agreements, students who make MCC the first stop towards earning a bachelor's degree can save up to 80 percent of the cost.

MCC's Career and Transfer Center helps students set academic and career goals and develop a plan for degree completion and optimal transfer. Approximately 37 percent of transferring MCC graduates enroll in Rochester-area colleges, including The College at Brockport, Rochester Institute of Technology, St. John Fisher College, SUNY Geneseo, Nazareth College and the University of Rochester.

# **Dual Admission Makes College** Affordable, Aids Completion



MCC's 2+2 Dual Admission Degree programs are guaranteed transfer programs offered in partnership with four-year colleges. Upon completion of a prescribed course sequence leading to an associate degree, students admitted to these programs are assured transfer with full junior-year status. Students pay one application fee and are admitted to MCC and the 2+2 college of their choice. Programs enable students to take the first two years of their bachelor's degree curriculum at MCC, then transfer as a junior to one of 28 participating four-year colleges.
