East Henrietta Road Reconstruction
Summer 2008

WEEKEND WORK IS HERE

Beginning Friday July 11 at 6 pm East Henrietta Road (Route 15A) will be reduced to a single lane in each direction between White Spruce Blvd. and Westfall Rd. The entrance ramp to I-390 Southbound will also be closed. Detour routes will be posted.

These restrictions will remain in place until Monday July 14 at 6 am. During this time crews will reconstruct the pavement on the east side of East Henrietta Rd, between Crittenden Rd and the bridge over I-390.

A second weekend of work will be scheduled for late-July or early-August to allow crews to reconstruct the pavement on the west side of East Henrietta Rd, between the bridge over I-390 and Crittenden Rd. During this time East Henrietta Rd will again be reduced to a single lane in each direction from Westfall Rd to White Spruce Blvd. Crittenden Rd will be closed at East Henrietta Rd. The ramp from West Henrietta Rd and I-390 SB to East Henrietta Rd will also be closed. Detour routes will be posted.

Reconstruction of Southbound Lanes Begins

On June 27, travel lanes between Metro Park and Crittenden Road were shifted to the new pavement on the east side of the road. Crews will now begin reconstruction of the pavement on the west side of the road.

The temporary sidewalk on the west side of the road will be maintained until completion of the permanent sidewalk on the east side of the road.

Reconstruction of the southbound lanes is expected to be completed by September 1.

Driveway Access

The NYSDOT staff will be working with the contractor to minimize disruptions to local residents and businesses. However, driveway access will be affected during construction.

Residents can expect to have their driveway blocked periodically. The contractor will notify property owners / residents prior to restricting driveway access.

At commercial properties the contractor will maintain at least one driveway during the construction work. The contractor may also contact property owners to suggest use of a temporary driveway entrance location.
