### **Public Safety Training Facility**

The Public Safety Training Facility is operated by Monroe Community College under a partnership agreement between the City of Rochester and the County of Monroe. The PSTF is responsible for the pre-service and in-service advanced training for all first responders including police, fire and emergency medical service personnel throughout Monroe County. Additionally, the facility provides specialized training for corrections officers, private security, probation officers, private industry, and aircraft rescue firefighters.
