

Workforce Training

Businesses, schools, nonprofit organizations, government and public agencies receive specialized training offered by the Office of Workforce Development, Public Safety Training Facility, Homeland Security Management Institute, and Agriculture and Life Sciences Institute. Whether it's in first response fields or technical careers such as advanced manufacturing, training is customized to fit clients' needs and can be delivered at MCC, off-campus sites or online.

Youth Programs

A total of 399 underrepresented and at-risk middle and high school students enrolled in academic enrichment programs.

Of about 1,044 MCC students surveyed, 94 percent said they would recommend the college to a friend or family member, according to the 2009 Community College Survey of Student Engagement.

Local employers continue to hire the vast majority of MCC graduates.

Named one of the nation's best community colleges by *The New York Times*, MCC is ranked among the top 10 in the country among community colleges for associate degrees awarded.

Faculty and staff have received 88 SUNY Chancellor's Awards recognizing excellence in teaching, professional service, librarianship, classified service, scholarship and creative activities.

MCC has unique dual-degree agreements with 25 four-year institutions, including many SUNY colleges.
