

The Lecture Capture Self-Record Facility

Narrated PowerPoints... lecture videos to "flip your classroom"... screen-captured video to use in your online course... audio and video podcasts... and more!

Multimedia learning objects such as these will soon be able to be produced in our Lecture Capture Self-Record Facility. Slated to open in early June, this facility will feature two soundproofed recording booths, tablet-style monitors that can be "written on" with a stylus, visualizers to record documents and objects, a Smart-Board, and more. Its construction is currently nearing completion in the space where our Faculty Innovation Center was previously located, and you'll be able to create your learning objects on your own or with the assistance of our Multimedia Staff (Steve Weider, Jeremy Case, Bailey Burritt, and Gerry Smith) located in offices that are directly adjacent.

Project Zoom & Closed Captioning

Bailey Burritt piloting Project Zoom video conferencing software for use in Open SUNY + and blackboard. In addition, it is being used between the MCC Writing Center and RSCD School 58 dual enrolled students in English 105.

Steve Weider and Jeremy Case are developing an affordable Closed Captioning solution for online courses and MCC video productions as well. Jeremy Case has submitted a Strategic Planning grant for purchasing captioning services that will be embedded with content on the college's ensemble server. The grant has been approved and plans are to begin offering captioning service in September 2015.


