II. REPORTS

- A. Speaker's Report Speaker Lawson...
 - ✓ **Speaker Lawson** has been busy this week with the usual Speaker jobs. Currently he has been helping the senators with their upcoming projects. He is very excited about the energy that the Senate has been showing in the last couple of weeks. If this motivation continues, there will be no reason why the Student Senate will not end on a positive note.
 - ✓ **Speaker Lawson** wanted to remind everyone about the next Board of Trustees' meeting on March 24th at 5:00 p.m. It will be an important meeting, because the finalists for the selection process of the next President of MCC will be announced at that time.

B. Deputy Speaker's Report Deputy Speaker Bickel...

- ✓ The Library Committee is in the process of launching a Spring marketing campaign to help make students more aware of the resources and services that are available to them. Some of these services include laptops, study rooms, individual databases, interlibrary loans, lectures and library services available at other libraries. The marketing campaign is in the initial stage, and we hope to have everything completed by mid-Spring semester.
- ✓ **Deputy Speaker Bickel** attended the Faculty Senate last week. The faculty has a leadership program for their staff. It was interesting to see that both the faculty and students have parallel leadership programs.

✓ **Deputy Speaker Bickel** would like to get a team together to start working on a letter encouraging the SUNY Administration and the MCC Board of Trustees' to keep the school's interests in mind while making their decision regarding the next president of Monroe Community College.

- ✓ **President Elliott** and Vice President Quider met with Jackie Woods and are looking into other fundraising possibilities. Jackie is getting very creative, so we should be in for a fun semester. She is currently looking into the possibility of scratch-off tickets.
- ✓ **President Elliott** asks Senators to not forget about the smoking policy change on the table. As a point of information for new senators, the Senate approved the policy. This action was vetoed by President Elliott. It takes a two-thirds vote to override the veto. President Elliott is looking to bring it back to the table for discussion.

E. Senator Reports

Senator Broyld...(submitted by e-mail)

- ✓ **Senator Broyld** discussed some issues with Monroe Doctrine concerning financing for an upcoming trip. However, he later found out that everything was taken care of.
- ✓ **Senator Broyld** spoke with officials of WMCC the Fuse about their upcoming event, "I Love New York 2." After a discussion, they came up with a conclusion that satisfied the parties involved.
- ✓ The Finance Committee viewed three applications, one of which will be approved today. Senator Bryold also discussed with Asst. Director of Clubs and Organizations, Shirley Provost, the process for clubs to request funds and wanted to remind them that, while funds may be available, necessary steps must be taken before funds can be approved.

✓ **Senator Esposito** is currently trying to set up a meeting with Dianna Phillips, Dean of Technical Education, to discuss ways to help out the Technical Education Students. He is also working with Senator Wingate to put on a viewing of "Shadow Company."

He plans to have the RA's help tie in programs with our pizza on Friday nights. Senator Woodward has also spoken with several officers from Cinema Studies, and they have shown great interest in taking part in what we are doing.
- ✓ **The Library Committee** is planning to do a "Spring Awareness of the Library" and Senator Woodward will be writing an article for the Monroe Doctrine.

- ✓ Faculty Advisor Stewart reported that on March 6, 2008 from 12:00 12:50 p.m., the New York State Department of Transportation will hold a project update for the East Henrietta Road Construction project. G. Faculty Advisor Faculty Advisor McCauley...

✓ Faculty Advisor McCauley reminded everyone that the underlying reason for participating in the Board of Trustees' meeting is to have the opportunity to leave a real legacy, and to get the best qualified academic administrator to lead MCC. It should be someone who can continue along the path forged by President Flynn and Dr. Spina in making MCC both a nationally and internationally recognized institution.

III. NEW BUSINESS

1. ACTION ITEMS (Items requiring a Senate vote)

a. Resolution to approve the release of funds to the Hospitality Club in the amount of \$528.

Resolved, that the Brighton Campus Student Government Association Senate approve the release of funds in the amount of \$528. to the Hospitality Club.

Speaker Lawson called for a motion to approve.

Senator Lynch so moved, seconded by Senator Darrow.

Discussion:

Kayla McCrossen from the Hospitality Club explained that they are requesting these funds for their annual trip to the National Restaurant Association Show, which will be held in Chicago. She indicated that without the funds requested, hospitality students would not be able to afford to go on this trip. The club originally asked for \$4,000, and she asked why they were only considered for \$528.

James Dean from the Hospitality Club stated that it is very important for these students to have an opportunity to go on this trip, and also asked why they were only considered for such a small amount. Senator Robinson explained that the bulk of the monies asked for were given to them by the Finance Committee and the remainder is being approved out of the SGA Contingency Fund.

A vote was taken.

Be it resolved, the Monroe Community College Brighton Campus Student Government Association unanimously approves the resolution to release the funds to the Hospitality Club in the amount of \$528.

ACTION ITEMS (Items requiring a Senate vote)

b. Resolution to approve the release of funds to WMCC The Fuse in the amount of \$800.

Resolved, that the Brighton Campus Student Government Association Senate approve the release of funds in the amount of \$800. to WMCC The Fuse.

Speaker Lawson indicated that this motion will be postponed until after the next Finance Committee meeting, in order for them to discuss this first.

IV. QUESTIONS & COMMENTS

President Elliott stated that he will be speaking at the SUNY Endowment event at SUNY Geneseo, due to the fact that President Flynn cannot attend. Money from the sale of Mega-Millions goes to SUNY schools, and he is hoping to push for community colleges to get a share of the monies that they deserve.

V. ADJOURNMENT

At 2:40 p.m. Speaker Lawson called for a motion to adjourn.

Senator Woodward so moved, seconded by Senator Darrow. The Senate meeting was adjourned.
