Evan Pritchard is of Mi'Kmaq and Celtic descent, and is the author of the critically acclaimed Native New Yorkers, No Word for Time, and the newly released Henry Hudson and the Algonquians of New York, all from Council Oak Books. He is also the author of Native American Stories of the Sacred (Skylight Paths) and many other books.

Evan Pritchard is a professor at Vassar University and has adjunct at Pace University and Marist College. He has taught Native American Studies, including Native American Religion at all three institutions. He has also written feature articles for the John Burroughs Society, Hudson Valley Museum Guide Magazine. He has also appeared on television (The History Channel, MSNBC and many local stations). He gave the keynote speech at the first planning session for the rebuilding of the World Trade Center site in 2001. For many years he has been an advisor and assistant to William Commanda, recognized by the United Nations as First Nations Grand Chief in 1949.
