

Making Choices for a Better World is the 2008 theme for Take Our Daughters And Sons To Work® Day.

The theme plays a key role in shaping the discussions at workplaces across the nation.

Making Choices for a Better World is broad in nature and encourages discussions among the participants because it is open to many interpretations on different levels by all segments of society: the individual, the family, groups, organizations, corporations - by everyone. The choices can be very personal ones such as whether to be self-motivated or not, whether to seek a good education or not, whether to vote, or whether to get involved in the community or not.

The choices for the family can involve how each family member relates to other family members and to the family as a whole - supporting each other, getting along, pulling together. The choices a family makes include those about neighbors, going green, the government, the whole community, the country, and the world - whether to be actively engaged or passively withdrawn not helping to create positive change nor helping to solve problems.

Groups, organizations, and corporations have many opportunities to make choices for a better world from the local level to worldwide level. They can choose or not choose: sexual and racial equality, helping the less fortunate, fair and unbiased workplace and community conditions, going green policies, promoting world peace and human dignity, and many more.

By implementing this year's theme, girls and boys can begin to think critically about how the choices they and the people in their lives make and how those choices can lead to a better world.
